



Code of conduct for club officials and volunteers

This Code of Conduct outline the good practice expected of you when working for INSPIRE

- Rights** Volunteers must respect the rights of children, young people and Adults, promoting their welfare and their individual needs related to the participation in their sports
- Relationships** Volunteers should promote relationships with participants that are based on openness, honesty, trust and respect. They must not engage in behaviour with participants, which is abusive or inappropriate. Volunteers must ensure they DO NOT TAKE ANY participants to the toilet by themselves.
- Responsibilities** Volunteers must demonstrate proper personal / professional Behaviour at all times promoting positive role models for children Young people and adults they are working with.
- Equality** Volunteers must demonstrate commitment to respecting differences between participants in terms of gender, race, ethnicity, disability, culture and religious belief systems.
- Expectations** Volunteers will be expected to lead small group tasks during sessions and will be briefed beforehand.
